We thank all our Exhibitors, Judges and Stewards who struggled in such trying conditions at the 2018 show.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

After the record rain event on the Sunday of the 2018 ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show, the ACT Government, who owns the grounds, has determined that no stables, can occupy the area we call the drag strip. That has severely limited where we can locate temporary stables or truck parking and therefore reduces the number of stables we can offer to exhibitors.

To alleviate some of the pressure, we have been forced to withdraw some breed classes that have had little support over recent years and reduce the number of classes in other sections.

Stallions have been most impacted and many breeds will no longer have stallion or colt classes; in others, the yearling classes have been excluded.

We are sorry that we have been forced to do this but we have no choice. It is a little ironic that we are now in a drought and it is a rain event only a few months ago that has brought these changes on.

We hope you understand and that you will still support the Show in as many classes as you are able to enter.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I yard my horses at my camp site?

We are aware that this may have occurred in previous years but unfortunately you are not able to yard horses near your campsite. This applies to all exhibitors – camping Area is strictly for people ONLY.
(Own yards may be used off float/Truck in Olive Grove Area only for a fee \$15 per night)

When will we find out if my entries have been accepted?

Acceptances will be issued before the office has their Christmas shutdown period. via email please check your spam junk folders – heading for emails will start with NOREPLY
ACCEPTANCE does not mean you have been allocated a stable

My horse is in the wrong height/age/gender class. Can I change it?

Of course! Just send us an email to horsesection@rcas.org.au with the following details;
Exhibitor name, horses name, incorrect class number, correct class number, reason for change and your name and number. We will send you a confirmation email once this has been completed.

When will I receive my breastplates and/or rider numbers?

You can collect your breastplate and armband at the horse office located near the marshalling area from 12pm – 6pm on Monday and 7am – 6pm on Tuesday to Sunday.

When will I receive my gate passes, camp site and camping bands?

You will receive all of this information at the gate upon entry to the show. Please ensure you present your acceptance letter for your OWN pack upon collection.

SHOW CHECKLIST

Please use this checklist as a guide to ensure you have all the information you need before completing your entry!

PLEASE NOTE:

Hard copy proof of registration (identity) is no longer required at time of entry.

We only require registration and microchip numbers upon entering!

All registration documents for **each horse** are required to accompany each horse to the show!

Hacks and Hunters require a minimum of one registration, which may be any relevant breed registration or Show Horse Council / EA registration etc. Horses in breed classes must submit the relevant registration papers for each different breed (eg. RPSB, WSPC, ASPA) where classes are entered at the show.

Entry Checklist:

- Exhibitor entries completed – please make sure that all details are accurate
- Exhibitors under 18 – Please ensure a parent/guardian is nominated
- Exhibitor eftpos details for prizemoney – complete bank account details
- Rider entry details – if entering rider classes
- Class details for each horse entered
- Horse Performance Record
- Registration and Microchip numbers
- Membership must be completed and paid online to receive the discounted entry before completing online entries.

Camping sites for the 2019 ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show have dramatically changed due to changes to the physical grounds of EPIC and the needs of the RNCAS. Traditional camping locations may no longer be in existence because of issue associated with the rain in 2018. New camping sites will be developed to cater for the larger transport rigs. Every endeavour will be made to locate camping sites near where your horses are located.

Also due to the Flooding last year stables will no longer be allowed along the drag strip.

Please ensure you read the site rules and requirements before applying for camping.

Camping is only permitted for the period Monday 18th February 2019 from 9.00 am to Sunday 24th February 2019. All campers must leave the grounds by 5.00PM Monday 25th February 2019.

Camping sites will be allocated according to the size of vehicles and camping facilities as specified when applying through the online system. A standard camping site is 10m x 3m; however larger sites will be created for larger size vehicles, with fees on a sliding scale. If your vehicle(s) or camping facilities, when fully set up, exceed 10m X 3m you are required to book extra space, sufficient to accommodate your vehicle(s) and all other equipment as set up. Ensure annexes are included in your measurements.

If your camping equipment exceeds your allocated space you will be moved to another location at the direction of the Camping Staff.

Every vehicle must be listed when entering online to receive authorised camping stickers. **Vehicles must be housed only on the site booked. Any additional vehicles not authorised will be removed from the camping zones and moved to the offsite parking areas.**

Camping site costs – all sites are booked for the period 9 am Monday 18th February to Sunday 24th February 2019 inclusive regardless of length of stay. Fees are payable in advance as per the table.

Electricity

Many vehicles require connection to more than one 10-amp power outlet. If you require more than one 10-amp outlet, additional power can be supplied at \$30.00 per 10-amp outlet. Each power outlet paid for will qualify for an authorised tag to attach to your power lead. All leads must be provided by Exhibitors and must have a current safety test and tag.

Unauthorised leads will be removed.

Note: it is compulsory for ALL leads (even brand-new leads) to have been safety tested & tagged before they can be used on the grounds.

Camping Rules

At all times campers must abide by the directions given by the Camping Supervisor or their support staff. Failure to abide by the Camping Staff directions will lead to removal from the site. With over 5,000 campers each camping group must stay on their allocated space and not impinge on any other camp site or camping group.

When applying for camping via the online system, it is agreed that you have read and understood all camping rules and regulations and will abide by them

How to work out your camping site requirements:

Camping on the grounds is in very high demand. There are restrictions on how many vehicles will be allowed. Exhibitors are entitled to request ONE camping 'site'. A single site can accommodate ONE of the following 3 options:

1. One car/ute/4WD and one of the following: caravan or trailer/float or tent OR
2. One rigid truck OR
3. One articulated vehicle combination e.g. one towing vehicle & one horse float OR one complete gooseneck rig

Any additional car/ute/4WD, truck, tent, caravan, trailer or float is considered a 'service' vehicle and may not be included on this single site; Exhibitors are to apply for a secondary site large enough to accommodate these extra vehicles/equipment and this site will only be allocated if there is sufficient space. If there is not enough room, extra vehicles can be parked in the public car park just outside Gate 8 at no charge (a pass will be provided). Powered and Non-Powered sites are not available as adjacent sites. You can book a powered camping site as your main camping site and a non-powered site as a secondary site to accommodate extra vehicles, but these sites will not be located together. Measure the vehicles that you wish to have parked on your main camping site. Work out the total space required then consult the table above to work out the fees payable when using the online system. Please note that ALL requested camping sites must be fully paid for at the time of entry.

Camping Rules: Camping is only permitted for the period 9.00 am Monday 18th February 2019 to 9.00 am Monday 25th February 2019

Camping Refunds:

Exhibitors who withdraw from the Show up to 9.00 am on Thursday 20 December 2018 may be eligible for a refund of any paid camping fees less a booking fee of \$100. Refunds will only be paid if the Horse Section is notified in writing by the deadline specified. **Exhibitors who withdraw after these deadlines or do not notify the society in writing by the deadlines, will not be eligible for any refund.**

Every endeavour will be made to locate camping sites near where your horses are located. However, the layout of the grounds and stables means that many people will not be able to be camped close to their horses. Please ensure you read the site rules and requirements before applying for camping. All applications for camping must be made at the same time as entering your horses for the 2019 Show.

A permit for every vehicle must be applied for at the time of entry to receive authorised camping stickers. **Vehicles must be housed only on the site booked. Any vehicle not authorised will be removed from the camping zones and moved to the public parking areas outside Gate 8.**

STABLING BY – LAWS

1. **Bedding will be organised by RNCAS for the 2019 Show 4 bags of sawdust will be supplied on arrival & stables locked.** Additional bedding will be available from feed/bedding merchant on site who you can contact before/during the show. Contact details for the supplier will be issued with acceptances on the information flyer.
2. Stabling is limited and not all Exhibitors will be offered stabling. **Acceptance of entries does not guarantee stabling.**
3. Stabling allocations are the responsibility of the Stabling Committee and all decisions are final
4. Please nominate a stable manager if you wish to be stabled with another exhibitor (stable manager will send a list of all exhibits to be stabled under their name in a group, you must all arrive and leave on the same days)
5. Do not send money for stabling at the time of entry. If stabling is allocated an invoice will be sent for your stable fees to your stable manager . Stable invoices must be paid by the due date. Failure to pay will result in automatic cancellation of stables.

Withdrawal of a exhibit after payment automatically forfeits your stable

6. Horses that are not allocated a stable at the time of acceptances will automatically go on a stable waiting list.
7. Unless an official Withdrawal Notice is received all horses will be assumed to be attending and will remain on the wait lists. An Exhibitor who does not attend and does not withdraw will be responsible for all stabling costs as booked.
8. Stable check-in time: 6.00 am on the day of arrival. Check-out time: 5.00 pm on the day of departure. Stable fees are charged for each day/ night the stable is occupied. Stable must be fully cleaned out to receive stable refund and checked off by staff member.
9. Stables not occupied by the assigned horse by 10am and not notified to the Ring Secretary's office will be reallocated.
10. Stables are allocated to specific horses and are not transferrable. Stables may only be used for housing horses and may **not** be used for any other purpose.(storing feed or gear). Failure to adhere to this rule will risk exclusion from all competitions.
11. Horses may not occupy stables prior to the check in time without the permission of stabling staff.
12. All horses must exit by the check-out time and stables must be left fully cleaned out ready for the next occupant.
13. A stable deposit of \$100 must be paid/held for each stable and only refunded when the stable is cleaned out and inspected by staff. , Failure to do so will forfeit your stable cleaning deposit
14. **REFUNDS** – Paid stabling fees will be refunded minus an administrative fee of \$50 if the stabling is cancelled in writing before Thursday 20th December 2018, and provided the stabling can be reallocated to a horse on the waiting list. Cancellations will be accepted in writing by mail or email only before the cut-off date

NO REFUNDS FOR ANY REASON AFTER 20th DECEMBER 2018 (REGARDLESS OF THE REASON)
irrespective of any veterinary or medical certificate being offered as evidence.

15. Horses normally stabled within a 100 km radius of EPIC will not qualify for stabling. This will be strictly policed.
16. Electric fences are not permitted on the grounds.
17. Stabling fees for the 2019 ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show are as follows (all prices include GST):
18. Stable deposit of \$100 for cleaning will be payable at time of stable booking –refunded if stable fully cleaned out and checked off by staff.

EXHIBITION BY-LAWS

1. ADVERTISING

No advertising matter of any description or any mark or sign indicating ownership or identity will be permitted on any Exhibit being judged or whilst in the arena.

2. AGE OF EXHIBITORS

The age of Junior Riders will be as at the first day of the Show, Wednesday 20 February 2019. All Junior riders must compete in an approved safety helmet

3. AGE OF HORSES

- The age of a horse is calculated as from 1 August. Every horse foaled before 1 August in any year is deemed to be one year old on that date (refer to "Age of Horses" table).
- A filly is a female horse under 4 years of age. A colt is an ungelded male horse under 4 years of age

4. AGGRESSIVE ANIMALS

Aggressive or uncontrollable behaviour by any horse while under the control of the marshalling stewards or while competing in the arena will render the Exhibit liable for disqualification from the class or classes concerned and from acceptance for entry at future Shows conducted by the Society.

5. ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION

Registration/Horse identification certificates must be shown at time of measuring.

6. ANIMAL SECURITY

Where an Exhibitor fails to properly secure any animal and bodily injury or property damage occurs, this may constitute a serious breach of insurance policy conditions and prejudice claims settlement.

7. APPLICATION FOR ENTRY

- Entries must be made online at www.mcas.org.au, and accompanied by suitable credit card payment.
- Must be lodged with the Ring Secretary prior to the closing date for entries as specified on the schedule cover.
- Entries received after the closing date as specified in the schedule, or entries received unaccompanied by the specified entry fees or registration papers will not be accepted.
- Faxed, mailed, email or telephone entries are not acceptable; the only exception being late entries which are to be made by email only and accompanied by the appropriate late entry fee. (see number 25)**

8. CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW

It is agreed between the parties that, if in the sole discretion of the Directors or the Chief Executive Officer or some other authorised officer that the Show is to be partially or fully cancelled for any reason whatsoever, the Exhibitor shall not pursue the Society for the recoveries of lost income or damages. This complete bar to an action applies to all headings of Law, whether it be Common Law in Contract or Tort or pursuant to any State, Territorial, or Commonwealth Statute Law. It is acknowledged by the Exhibitor that the Society has no duty to have a Show in any particular year and that this Clause operates as a complete defence for the Society to any such action.

9. CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

Competitors who have multiple entries eligible for Championship competitions will be permitted to compete with each of their Exhibits. Competitors must present their Exhibits with properly attired riders into the ring, and will be permitted to change onto their other horses for their individual workouts. Competitors should advise the Red Coats and Ring Stewards to allow for an orderly display of their Exhibits.

10. CHIEF HORSE STEWARD

The powers of the Society, its Board and its Chief Executive Officer described in these By-Laws have been delegated, in the respect of the Horse Section, to the Chief Horse Steward.

11. CLASHES WITH CLASSES

When entering Classes from the Horse Schedule please be aware that due to the complicated nature of the 4 day program there are likely to be clashes between some Classes. We are aware of these and every endeavour has been made to eliminate them, where possible.

However, due to horses having multiple registrations and the fact that as many as six Classes are run at the same time, in different rings, it is not possible to eliminate all Class clashes.

Therefore, where these occur, the Exhibitor may have to make a choice between one Class and the other. Your cooperation will be much appreciated.

12. CONSENT OF IMAGES

All Exhibitors, owners and competitors agree to the RNCAS publishing or reproducing information and images associated with them and with their Exhibits at any time, in any medium, for any purpose. This includes live streaming of video, if utilized at the Show.

13. CONTROL OF SHOW

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society shall have the power without assigning any reason to:

- (i) Reject or cancel any entry any time;
- (ii) Prohibit the participation by any person or Exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered;
- (iii) Cancel any event or class;
- (iv) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place;
- (v) Alter the conditions of any event;
- (vi) Remove any Exhibit from Exhibition Park in Canberra;
- (vii) Alter the date or time for the closing of entries for any section or class or for any particular entry;
- (viii) Transfer an Exhibit or Exhibitor from any class to any other class.

The Exhibitor shall at all times comply with the directions or requests of the Council, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society. This shall without limiting the generality of the foregoing apply to the entry, the animal, the Exhibitor, the conditions of the event, the conduct of the Exhibitor, the conducting of the event, the decisions of the Judge and the awarding of the prize.

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society reserve the right to adjudicate on any entry or upon any question in dispute or doubt and to make any determination upon any matter whether covered by the conditions of entry or not and the decision so made shall be final and binding and the Society shall thereby have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show and the Exhibits and Exhibitors. There shall be no right of appeal to any court of law or other body from any decision made by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society.

The RNCAS reserves the right to rule at any time that any Exhibit, Exhibitor or competitor may not compete. This right remains notwithstanding the Society's acceptance of entry, its inclusion in the Society's catalogue or the issue by the Society of an Exhibit ticket, number or any other document.¹

14. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

No Exhibitor shall engage in, or be knowingly involved in, cruelty to any animal. The RNCAS shall be the sole judge of what constitutes animal cruelty, but it may include:

- a. To whip or beat an animal excessively,
- b. To subject an animal to any kind of electric shock,
- c. To use spurs, or jab a horse with a bit, excessively or persistently,
- d. To remount, or attempt to remount, an exhausted, lame or injured horse,
- e. To rap a horse,
- f. To hyper sensitise any part of the animal,
- g. To deny an animal adequate food, water or exercise,
- h. To tie a tongue in any manner.

Any case of cruelty must be reported to the Chief Steward.

The Society may, in its sole discretion and in the light of all information made available to it, apply penalties which may include, but are not limited to:

- a. Expulsion from the grounds,
- b. Disqualification and forfeiture of any prizes won,
- c. The levying of a monetary fine,
- d. Disqualification from future Royal Canberra Show

15. DEFINITION OF A STABLING MANAGER

For all Horse Competitions, a Stabling Manager MUST be nominated on the Application for stables form. This person will be responsible for all stabling administration. The Stabling Manager is the reference point for stabling of multiple Exhibits from different Exhibitors who wish to be stabled together where possible.

16. DISCLAIMER

The information contained in this publication is gathered for the purpose of providing information to our Exhibitors and Show patrons. The information is a compilation of information provided by third parties and the RNCAS does not warrant its accuracy and advises that any such information may be subject to change or amendment occurring at any time and thereby making the information incorrect. Subject to the RNCAS' legal obligations and responsibilities. If you require confirmation of any information please telephone the RNCAS

17. ENTER AT OWN RISK

The Exhibitor enters entirely at his or her own risk. In case any Exhibit whilst on the Society Showgrounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor or to the personal property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner of such Exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers, officials and members from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such Exhibits. The Exhibitor shall be liable to the Society and its employees, officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the Exhibit or the Exhibitor or his agent.

18. ENTRY FEES

Entry fees must be paid in full at the time of entry.

19. ENTRY RESTRICTION

Restrictions or limitations on the number of entries in any section may be made by Chief Horse Steward.

20. FIRE REGULATIONS

No Smoking in Horse Stalls or Pavilions. Primus stoves or naked lights are not permitted in Horse Stalls or Pavilions.

21. GATE PASSES

Exhibitors will be allocated passes on the following scale:

1-3 Horses	-	2 Passes **
4-5 Horses	-	3 Passes **
6 or more Horses	-	4 Passes **

22. GRAND PARADES

All horses on grounds **MUST** be shown in the grand parade. Mounted horses may be led under special circumstances provided a member of the Horse Committee approves this request.

o Grand Parade Attire

The attire worn in competitive classes is the standard attire for the Grand Parade. If incorrect attire is worn, the voucher for admittance to the Grand Parade may be rejected and as a result a fine may be issued.

Hats must be worn in Grand Parade led and ridden

Grand Parade is Saturday at 4pm and Sunday 2.30pm.

o Exemption from Grand Parades

Exemptions may only be obtained from a designated representative of the Horse Committee between **10.00 and 11.00 am** at the Ring Secretary's Office on the day of the grand parade. Provided your exemption is granted, you will then be required to surrender one Grand Parade ticket as well as the approved exemption form. If an exemption is approved for both the Saturday and Sunday, both participation tickets are required to be surrendered with your approved form. Being absent from the showgrounds is not a valid reason for failing to parade. **Exhibitors with more than one horse are only required to pay an exemption if at least one Grand Parade mount is not nominated and paraded. Parade exemptions may be granted to Exhibitors who produce a current medical or veterinary certificate with application for exemption. Once the Society is presented with a medical or veterinary certificate together with an application for exemption to participate in a Grand parade, such exemption, if approved, will cause the ineligibility of the rider and/or horse from all classes of competition for the same day of the exemption or the validity period of the certificate, provided it is no greater than the calendar year of competition.**

o Failure To Comply

Exhibitors failing to produce their voucher(s) may be fined \$100 for each voucher not presented. Failure to pay any fee incurred **by 31 December 2019** will result in refusal of entries for future shows.

23. HELMETS –Hats

All Persons riding a horse must wear approved safety helmets to the current Australian, European, British or American Standard whilst mounted including but not limited to Competition and exercise arenas (unless otherwise specified). The restraining helmet harness must be secured and fastened at all times. Only helmets bearing one or more the standards below are accepted: AS/NZS 3838 (current Australian Standard) provided they are SAI Global marked ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked VG1 (01.040:2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked ASTM F1163 (current US Standard) SNELL E2001

TOP HATS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE, including in Sidesaddle classes

24. JUDGING

- The Society accepts no responsibility if the judging time happens to conflict with one or more classes or events.
- The Judge's decision is final.
- Champions and Reserve Champions: First prize winners only are eligible for judging of Champion. Reserve Champions will be selected from remaining first prize winners and the second prize winner from the class that provided the champion.

25. LATE ENTRIES

A late entry option is available under the following conditions:

- Late entries may only be submitted via email to horsesection@rncas.org.au and will be accepted for 14 days after the official closing date (by 5.00 pm)
- An additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee is paid per class, eg class fee \$50 x 3= \$150.per class entered.

26. LEADING REIN/FANCY DRESS

Ponies which are to be ridden in leading rein/fancy dress classes must have been accepted for and competing in a class or classes for breed or hacks at the 2019 ActewAGL Royal Canberra Show.

27. LIABILITY FOR EXHIBITS

The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or for any damage or injury occasioned to any Exhibit or the property of any Exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.

28. MARSHALLING

- Exhibitors and competitors shall be present in the marshalling yard and be ready to be judged at least 15 minutes prior to the time specified in the timetable for judging of the event.
- Three calls only will be made to the marshalling yard - two warning calls then the final call.
- Late competitors and Exhibits will only be allowed to enter the arena at the Chief Horse Steward's discretion.
- Ridden Classes Rider only and Led Classes Handler only will be permitted in the Marshalling Area.

29. MEASURING/ IDENTIFICATION

ALL horses entered in the 2019 Canberra Royal Show must be presented to be identified by the Official Measurer before competing. When presenting your horse, please have a current copy of relevant breed/registration papers and the breastplate number.

Horses competing in height restricted classes must be measured. Horses will not be measured unless the breastplate number is produced to the Official Measurer. Current Height Certificates may be accepted at the discretion of the Official Measurer.

Any Exhibitor who by himself or any agent:

- directly or indirectly presents a horse which has an identity other than its true identity,
- does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly identified,
- does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly measured, or
- presents a horse for measuring when the horse has had any Prohibited Substance administered to it is automatically disqualified from Exhibiting in any Class at the Show.

The RNCAS may, in its discretion and without assigning any reason, refuse to measure any horse presented for measuring if, in its opinion, the horse is not in a fit or proper condition to be measured or, in its opinion, any circumstances exist which are likely to lead to the horse being incorrectly measured.

The RNCAS may in its discretion request that a horse be swabbed. Any amendment to the height appearing on the breastplate number may only be made by the Official Measurer.

When measuring a horse, an allowance of up to 1cm or 3/8 inch may be made for shoes.

A horse will be transferred to another Class if it is determined by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the Class for which it has been entered. **Horses presented for measuring at the measuring box must be suitably bitted.**

A horse presented for measuring will be allowed a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes in the measuring box before being measured. Should the Exhibitor request a further period of time before being measured, one further period of fifteen (15) minutes maximum will be permitted, at a later time. At the conclusion of this second period of measure the horse's breastplate number will be stamped with the horse's height as determined by the Official Measurer.

Registration papers of each Exhibit must be produced for identification purposes at the time of measuring.

EA & Show Hack Council life measuring certificates may be accepted on presentation of Animal to be identified.

30. MEMBERS ENTRY FEE CONCESSION

Financial members of the RNCAS may claim a 20% reduction on total entry fees where total of entry fees are \$50.00 or more.

NB: Membership is ascribed to an individual ONLY and must be in an individual Person's name, not a company or group of people.

31. MISREPRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS

Proved wilful misrepresentation of Exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but render the Exhibitor liable to be disqualified from Exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. The onus of proof as to the bona fides will rest upon the Exhibitor.

32. NON EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS

Every horse entered and not withdrawn by Wednesday 20 February 2019 must be Exhibited unless a Withdrawal Form signed by the Exhibitor or his authorised agent is lodged with the Society 24 hours before the time of the relevant class stating that the animal is unable to compete. Failure to do so may incur a penalty of \$50 per Exhibit and per class.

33. NUMBERING OF EXHIBITS

- a. Numbers corresponding to the number in the catalogue must be worn by each Exhibit when appearing before the Judge. Exhibit numbers must be collected from the Horse Ring Secretary's office
- b. Exhibit numbers, in the form of a breastplate number, must be worn by all Exhibits on the Exhibit around the neck, or in the case of an Exhibit in a horse drawn vehicle, on the vehicle in a prominent and visible place. Numbers are assigned to individual Exhibits; different numbers are required for riding class. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that the correct breastplate number is displayed for a particular class.
- c. Ring stewards will ensure that all Exhibits paraded before the judge are eligible to compete in the class are wearing the number shown in the official catalogue and class card. Exhibits not recorded in the official catalogue or class card will not be judged. If name is not listed in catalogue check with Ring Secretary, or have a copy of your class transfer paper work
- d. Breastplate numbers should be displayed on the horse using a breastplate holder.

34. NOVICE CLASSES

If you win a NOVICE CLASS at a Royal prior to the 2019 Royal Canberra Show, it is the Exhibitor's responsibility to officially withdraw from the Novice Class entered into, or transfer into an Open Class, if not already entered. If a horse has won an Open/Childs/Adult/Lady/Gent Class at a State Royal Show it is no longer considered a novice.

35. OFFENSIVE BEHAVIOUR

All persons causing annoyance by;

- a. Making loud comments, or by other offensive behaviour, on the decisions of Judges, Stewards or other officials; or
- b. The use of swearing or foul language will after being cautioned by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative, be expelled from the ground and if a competitor, be liable for disqualification and forfeiture of any prize money won.

36. OFF THE TRACK CLASSES

The event is open to all thoroughbreds that have officially raced or trialed either locally, nationally or internationally. All horses are required to be 3 years and over and 14.2hh. All horses will be registered with RISA. (Racing Information Service Regulations) *Registrations will be checked. 2. Racing name to be used. When entering an Off the Track (OTT) event, if the horses name has changed

37. OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

- a. The Exhibitor is responsible for the care and control of the Exhibit on the Showground and compliance with the RNCAS Rules and Regulation.
- b. If the legal owner of the Exhibit is different to the Exhibitor, the legal owner/s must be listed on the Application for Entry ('the Owner').
- c. The Owners may be jointly responsible for the care and control of the animal and be brought into Disciplinary Proceedings at the RNCAS' discretion.
- d. If an Exhibit is sold after the entry has been made, the RNCAS must be notified in writing with a payment of \$55. The seller or the purchaser may make the notification, no later than 14 days before the date of Exhibition. If no notification is made and/ or alteration not paid for, the Exhibit may be disqualified from all classes and no refunds of any fees pertaining to that Exhibit will be made.

38. PERFORMANCE

Performance must be given on the entry form for each horse or pony nominated. Nominations in stated classes for horses will not be accepted without recognised performance where required. List the six (6) BEST performances for each horse. Only **one (1)** performance per Show and a maximum of one (1) Hack Council/EA affiliated Show performance per horse will be accepted.

A qualifying performance must be achieved at recognised Shows in the 12 months prior to the closing of entries. From the Information contained on the Performance Form the Society will, at its discretion, determine which entries are to be accepted. The qualifying period is 1 October 2017 to 15 October 2018. Additional performances will be accepted until the 30 October 2018 for stabling allocations.

39. PRIZE RIBBONS

Ribbons and rosettes may be awarded based on the number of Competitors in the Class on the day of Competition in accordance with the following table:

- Up to 5 Exhibits 3 ribbons
- 5 to 10 Exhibits 5 ribbons
- 11 to 20 Exhibits 6 ribbons
- 21 Exhibits and over 7 ribbons

40. PRIZE MONEY

- a. All prize money will be paid by the RNCAS via Electronic Funds Transfer after the conclusion of the Show. Exhibitors must supply a valid BSB and bank account number at the time of submitting their entries via the online entry system. Should an Exhibitor not submit valid banking details all monies will be forfeited.
- b. All Exhibitors agree to the RNCAS deducting from their prize money any outstanding balances owing to the RNCAS including but not limited to; stabling costs, membership fees or camp site charges.
- c. **Prize money will be issued to Exhibitors by 31 March 2019**
- d. If due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming for classes in which the prize money is sponsored, prize money will be paid by the RNCAS at the amount that is printed in the relevant section of the schedule.

e. Only 1st Prize money will be paid for classes with five (5) or less competitors competing in the event unless specified.

41. PRIZE MONEY AND THE GST

The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.

The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable. Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST

GST will not apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia. GST will apply:

42. PROTESTS

All protests must be delivered to the Ring Secretary's office no later than one (1) hour after the event, after which no protest will be entertained. Each protest must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50.00, which will be forfeited at the discretion of the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative if they consider the protest frivolous. Protests will be dealt with by the protest committee as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

43. RIDING COMPETITIONS

Riding Competitors must ride an Exhibit that has been accepted for and competing in a Class or Classes for Breed, Hack or led in the 2019 Royal Canberra Show. Heavy Horses cannot be used as a mount in Riding Classes.

44. RED COATS/STEWARDS

During Shows conducted by the RNCAS the failure of an Exhibitor to comply with directives issued by a Red Coat escorting Classes into or out of the Arena, or Horse Section (Ring or Marshalling Steward) official shall automatically render the Exhibitor involved, liable for disqualification and for non-acceptance of entry at future Royal Canberra Shows.

45. REFUNDS

No refund of entry fees will be made after acceptances have been **issued** by RNCAS.

No refund of **any fees**, entry stabling or camping fees will be made after **18 January 2019. NO EXCEPTIONS including vet certificates after this date**

46. REPLACEMENT OF AN EXHIBIT

The replacement of an Exhibit entered in a class, with a substitute Exhibit is NOT permitted (Including riding classes).

47. RIDING, HACK & SHOW HUNTER CLASSES – AGE RESTRICTIONS

All Exhibits in ridden Pony Hack classes, Breed classes, Show Hunter, Working Show Hunter or Riding classes not exceeding 12.2 hands must be ridden by a rider less than 17 years of age.

All Exhibits in ridden Pony Hack classes, Breed Classes, Show Hunter, Working Show Hunter or Riding Classes over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 14 hands may be ridden by adults or children.

All Exhibits in ridden Galloway classes, Breed Classes, Show Hunter, Working Show Hunter or Riding Classes over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands must be ridden by a rider 9 years and over, unless otherwise stated.

All Exhibits over 15 hands in Hack classes, breed classes, Show Hunter, Working Show Hunter or Riding classes must be ridden by a rider 12 years and over.

48. SCHEDULE CONDITIONS

Conditions printed in the Schedule relative of class breed or group of classes will be observed.

49. STALLIONS

- a. Stallions entering the arena must be under the control of an experienced handler, rider or driver, 17 years or over, with the exception of Shetland ponies.
- b. Stallions are only eligible to compete in harness turnout classes and classes for Driven Stallions.
- c. All Stallions or Colts 1 year and over competing in led classes MUST be shown in a bit.
- d. **A Green Stallion disc needs to be displayed at all times.**

50. SUITABILITY OF ATTIRE

Riders, drivers and contestants must be suitably attired. Hats must be worn in the Main Arena. A rider, driver or contestant not suitably attired shall be precluded by the Society from competing in any event. Riders, drivers and contestants shall wear at all times when in the Main Arena whether during the Grand Parades or otherwise the same or similar attire as is worn in the judging ring in which they or the animals of which they are in charge were Exhibited. **Tennis and gym type shoes are not permitted.** No long boots or gaiters to be worn by Riders under 17 competing in riding classes.

51. TESTS AND SWABBING

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative may make or cause to be made any test of any Exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such Exhibit for any of the following purposes and detain such horse for such period as is deemed necessary. A compulsory drug testing levy per horse will apply and is incorporated within class entry fees. It is the intention of these regulations that all animals shall perform on their merits without the aid of drugs which will affect the conduct, performance or appearance of the animal.

An Exhibitor shall not administer and shall procure that there shall not be administered to his Exhibit any drug or substance herein call "a prohibited drug". Prohibited drugs are substances originating externally whether or not they are endogenous to the animal and means any performance or behaviour of an animal by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary digestive system, the musculoskeletal system or the urogenital system and shall include analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local

anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquillisers and vitamins. The use of antibiotic substances (anti-viral, anti-microbial, or anti-parasitic) with the exception of Procaine Penicillin may be permitted.

The Society may at its discretion cause an examination to be made of an Exhibit by a Veterinary Officer who in the course of such examination may make by such methods as he may determine such tests of and take such samples from such Exhibit as he deems necessary or advisable. The result of such examination shall be reported to the Society.

An Exhibit to which, in the opinion of a Veterinary Officer, a prohibited drug has been administered shall not be Exhibited without consent of the Society and shall be removed from the Showground forthwith upon notice from the Society.

The Society may in its sole discretion and in the light of all information made available to it disallow or cancel the entry and any award made to the Exhibit, without in such case being called upon to give any reason therefore.

The owner or any other person who was in charge of an animal to which a prohibited drug has been administered may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of an animal in any event or class at the Show any drug as defined above or has in his possession any improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Particular attention will be paid to the detection of sedative and tranquilliser groups of drugs but analysis for all classes of prohibited substances will be included. The collection of samples *inter alia* will always involve taking urine and/or blood.

An examination may include an examination for desensitised limbs. Any animal found to have a limb or part of a limb desensitised by any means will be considered to have competed under the influence of a prohibited substances and penalised accordingly.

The owner or his representative may be present during testing but shall not interfere in any way with the conduct of the test, and will observe the instructions of the veterinary officer on duty. In the absence of the Exhibitor and/or owner the Society recognises the rider, and/or handler and/or driver as the authorised agent of the Exhibitor.

The Society and any servant or appointee of the Society shall not be liable to the Exhibitor, owner or other interested parties, for the death of, or for any injury, damage or infection which may be sustained by an Exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any servant, agent or appointee of the Society done or committed in the course of his examination whether due to the negligence of any such servant, agent or appointee or otherwise.

Any Exhibit which has been brought to the Showgrounds and is found by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative to have had administered a drug as defined above, the owner and any person who is in charge of the horse may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of a horse in any event or class at the Show any drug defined above, or improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society.

52. TIME OF ARRIVAL

All Exhibits are to be on the ground not later than when specified in the schedule. No entry to the show grounds before Monday 9.am 18th February 2019

53. TRANSFER & RE-CLASSIFICATION

- a. Should a horse be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under the height stipulated for the class in which it has been entered, the owner may lodge an application in writing on the form provided with the Ring Secretary to have the entry transferred to a corresponding horse class in which the Exhibit is eligible to compete.
- b. Should a horse cease to be eligible to compete in the class or classes entered for any reason other than height, an application for transfer or re-classification may be made in writing to the Ring Secretary for decision by the Chief Horse Steward or Deputy on duty.
- c. Should the eligibility of a horse to compete in a class in which an entry has been accepted, be questioned prior to the judging of the class the Ring Secretary and/or Ring Steward will so advise the Chief Horse Steward or his Deputy on duty before the judging of the class is completed.
- d. Judges and Ring Stewards are not authorised to consider applications for transfer or re-classification or to make any additions or alterations to information contained on official class cards.

54. TRANSPORT

Horse transports will not be permitted to leave Exhibition Park until after the Grand Parade on Saturday and Sunday unless an exemption form has been obtained from the Chief Horse Steward.

55. VEHICLE PERMIT

Every vehicle entering the Showgrounds will require a vehicle permit. Campers will be issued with vehicle permits as part of their camping fee.

UNAUTHORISED PARKING WILL BE POLICED.


56. WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals from classes must be made in writing and can be sent via email to: horsesection@rncas.org.au. Emailed withdrawals must include the following information; Exhibitor name, class number, Exhibit number (if known) and Exhibit name (if applicable). No refund of entry fees will be made after acceptances have been issued by RNCAS.

However, once the Show commences on Wednesday, 20th February 2019, withdrawals from classes will only be accepted on the official RNCAS withdrawal form, available from the Ring Secretary's Office. **No emails of withdrawals accepted from 18th February 2019.**

Withdrawals MUST be presented to the Ring Secretary's office no later than 7am on the day of competition. Failure to do so will incur a penalty of \$50.00. Failure to pay any fee incurred by 31 December 2019 will result in refusal of entries for future shows.
